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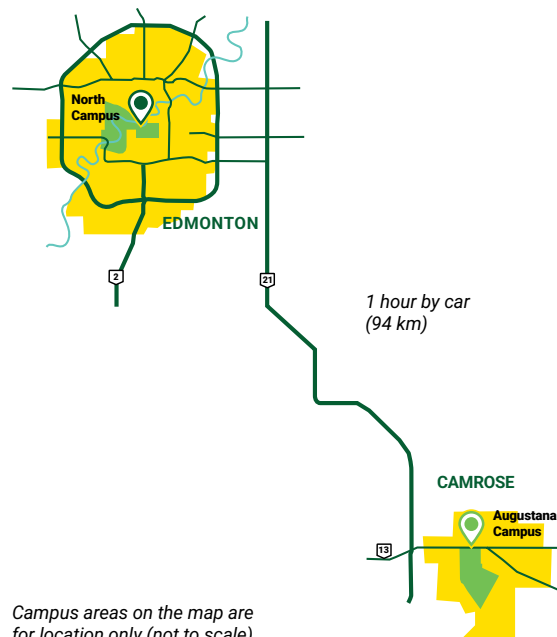

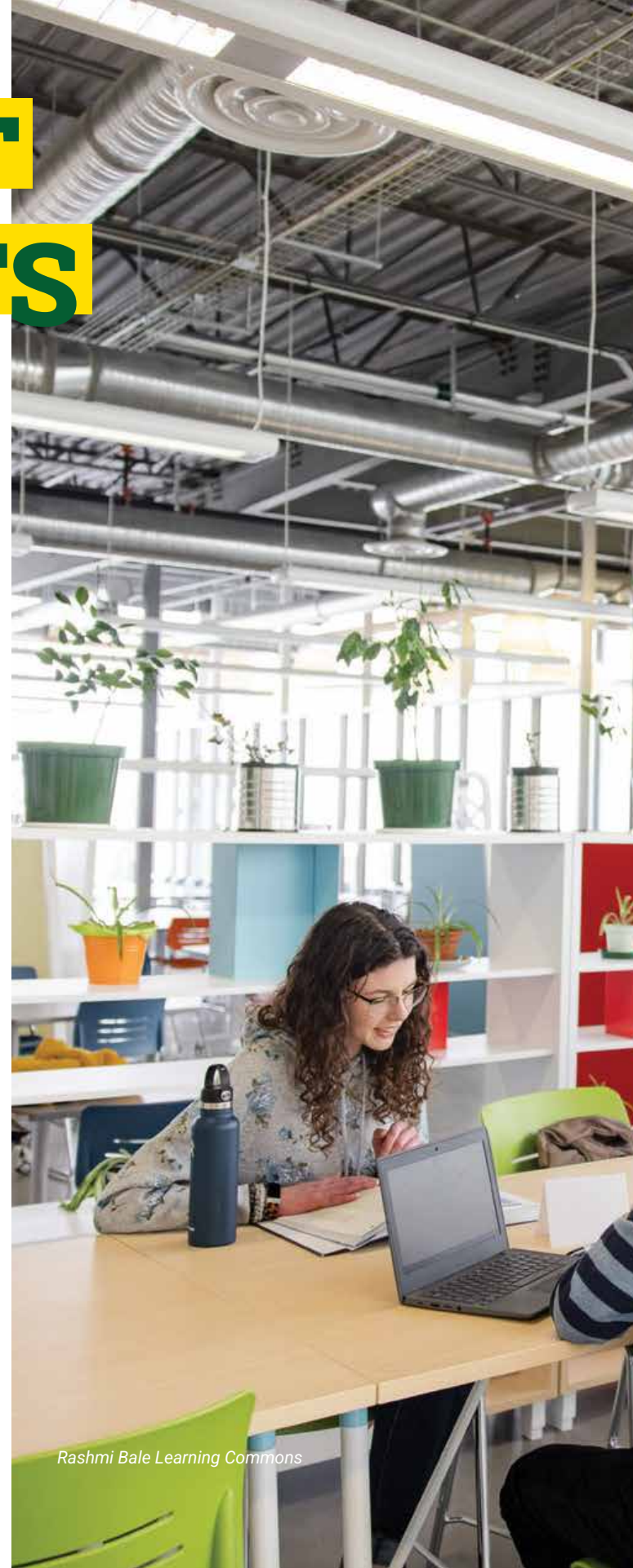

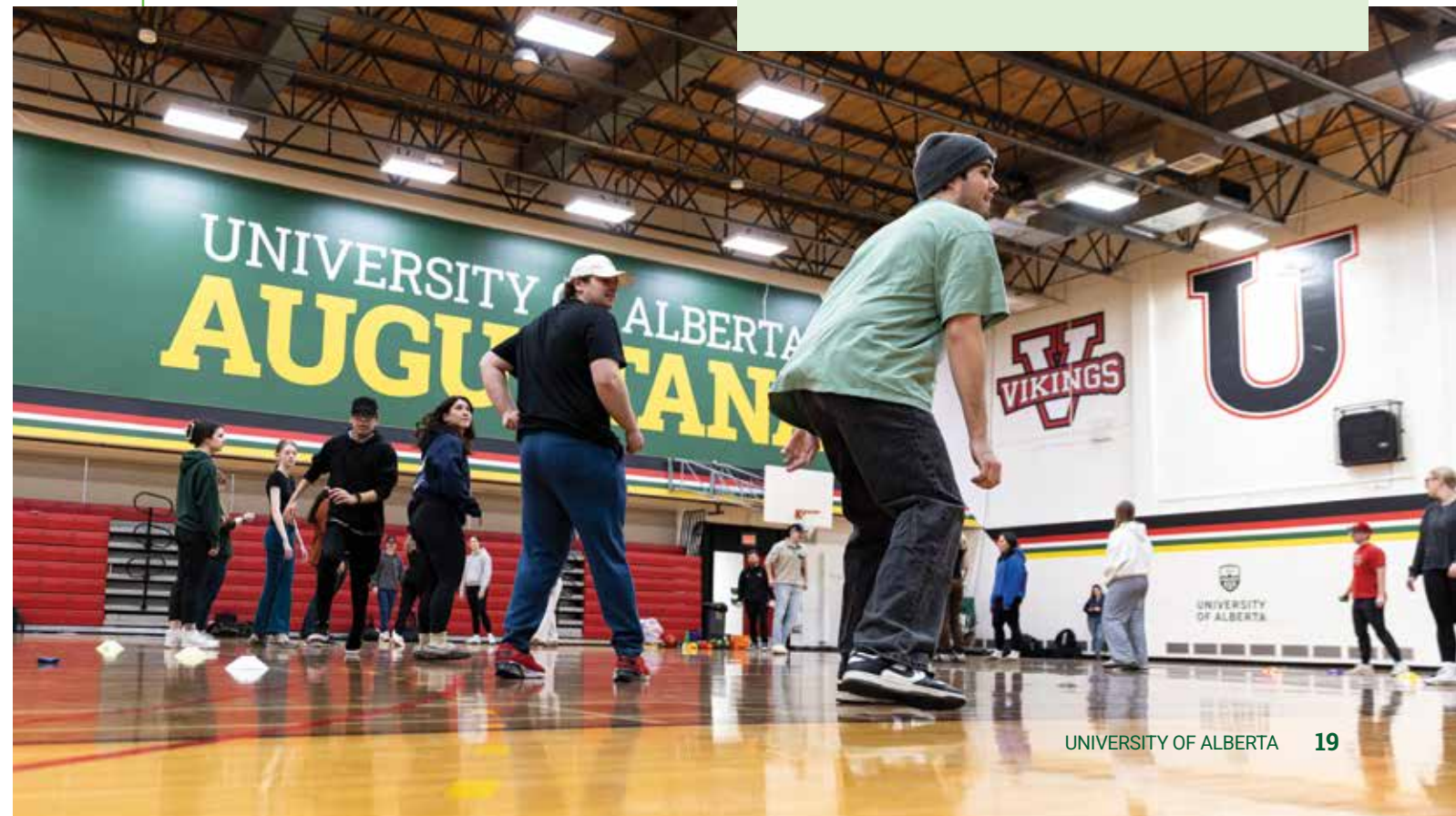

Earn a master of science in occupational therapy, physical therapy or speech-language pathology right here at Augustana Campus. Courses are a blend of traditional face-to-face instruction and online learning. All programs include clinical placements.

PLACEMENTS AND CAREER

Hoping to work and live in rural Alberta? Our students can complete more clinical placements/fieldwork in rural locations and may have access to electives with a rural focus.

MINIMUM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Must have a four-year bachelor's degree from an accredited post-secondary institution.
- Admission GPA of at least 3.0 on the 4-point scale from the University of Alberta or an equivalent qualification and standing from a recognized institution.
 - GPA will be calculated on the last 60 units of graded, eligible coursework completed, roughly equivalent to the last two years of full-time graded coursework.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

In 2025, Augustana students received over **\$1.4 million** in undergraduate scholarships, awards and financial support.

Application-Based

APPLYING FOR AWARDS IS EASY. Just fill out a single application, and we will match you to a potential scholarship or award based on your background, experiences, academics and interests. The deadline for application-based awards is **January 10, 2027**, and you must apply to your program first.

Augustana Opportunities Award

Awarded to students with satisfactory academic standing entering the first year of an undergraduate degree at Augustana. Selection is based on indicated financial need and academic standing. Preference is given to students who are First Nation, Inuit or Métis applicants. Eight awards of \$5,000 available each year.

Entrance Leadership Scholarship

Well-rounded leaders with demonstrated contributions to their community may receive up to \$5,000.

Augustana Education Award

Students in an education program at Augustana may receive an award of \$2,500.

Admission-Based

RECEIVE A SCHOLARSHIP YOU DON'T EVEN HAVE TO APPLY FOR! Eligibility for these scholarships is based on your admission average at the time of your admission offer. Apply early so you can be assessed for the most awards.

Cora Martinson Scholarships

The Cora Martinson Scholarships are awarded to domestic and international students entering Augustana. A total of eight students per year can receive a scholarship of up to \$18,000 per domestic student and up to \$56,000 per international student (each payable over four years).

Gold Standard Scholarship

The top 5% of students in each faculty could receive up to \$6,000, depending on admission average.

Indigenous Entrance Scholarship

First Nations, Métis or Inuit applicants with an average of 80%+ may receive \$1,500.
