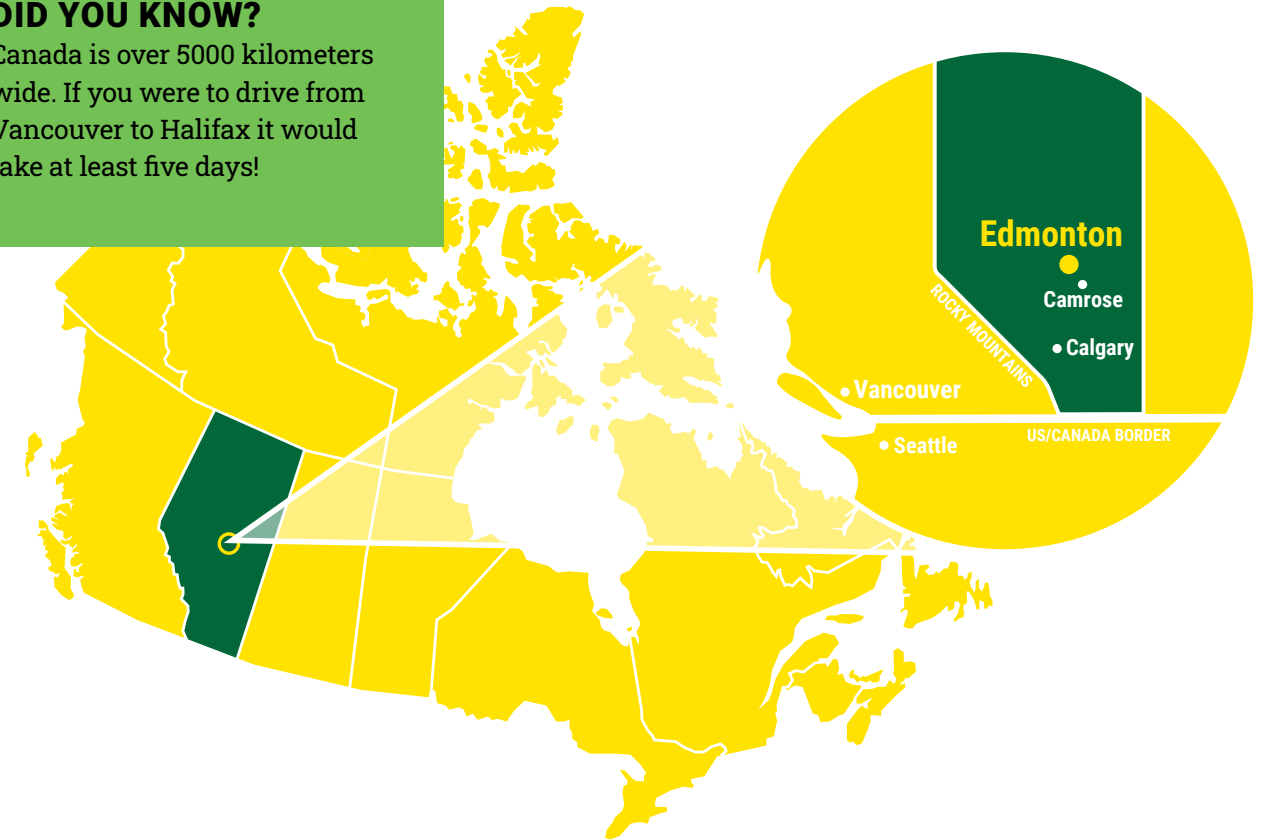

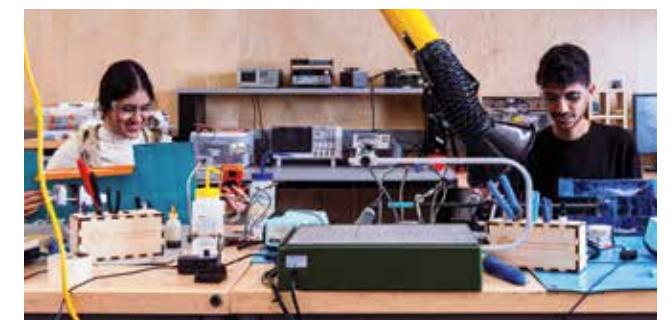

2 AFTER YOU APPLY

UNDERSTAND EVALUATION

- Admission to the U of A is competitive and on-going, meaning some students can receive an admission offer as early as October.
- Admission averages are calculated using the five required courses for your program(s) of choice, informed by the courses and final marks included on your application.

NOTE: Where final grade 12 marks are unavailable, the final mark in the equivalent grade 11 course and grade 12 course registrations will be used.

Some programs may have additional requirements for admission, such as the Casper assessment.

CHECK YOUR STATUS

- After applying, you will have access to our applicant portal, Launchpad. Here you can check your application status, submit outstanding documents, update new final marks and review any checklist items for your program.
- We will also assign you a U of A email address to check for notifications or correspondence.

3 AFTER YOU ACCEPT

ACCEPT YOUR OFFER AND APPLY FOR YOUR STUDY PERMIT

- Once you receive an admission offer, you must accept it and pay the tuition deposit by the deadline stated in Launchpad.
- Don't forget to accept your residence offer!

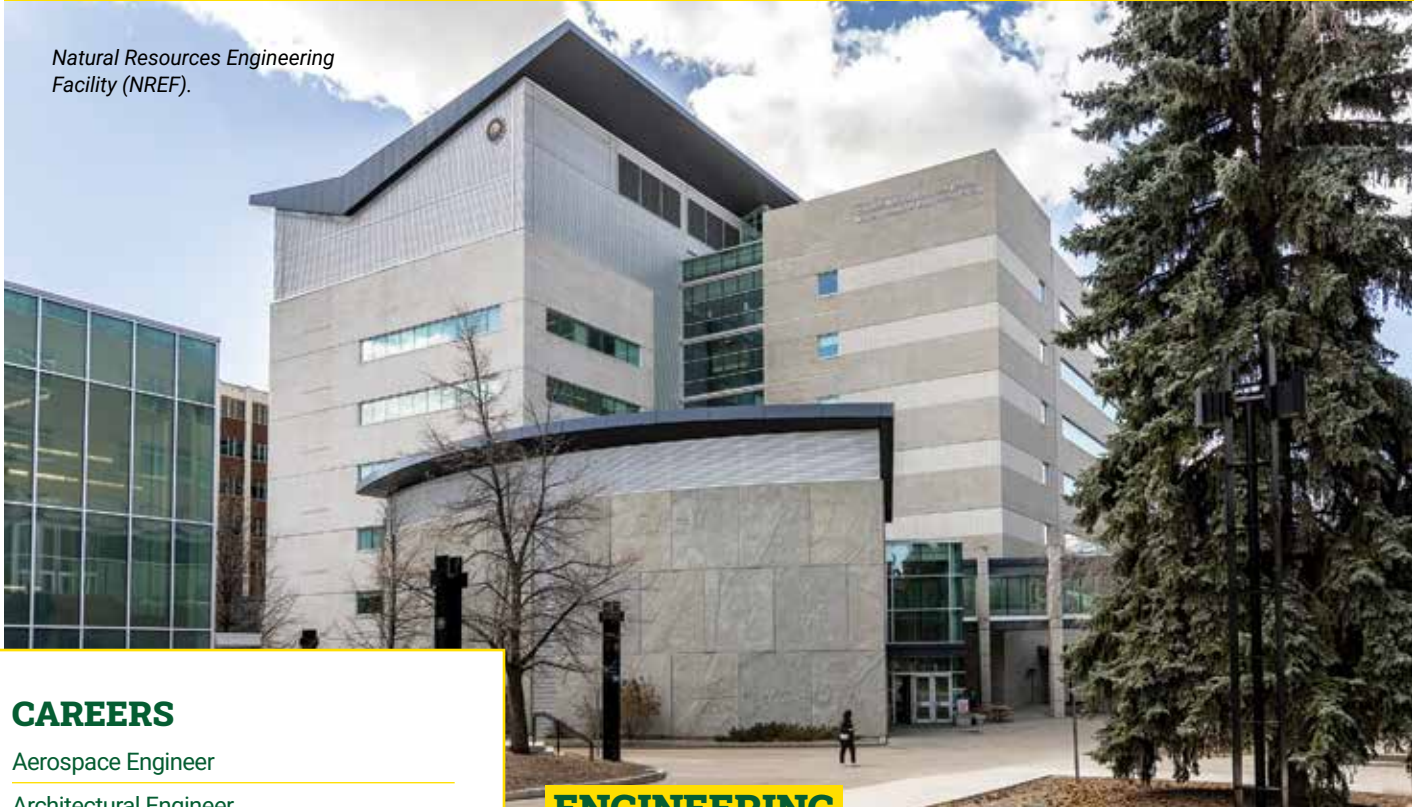

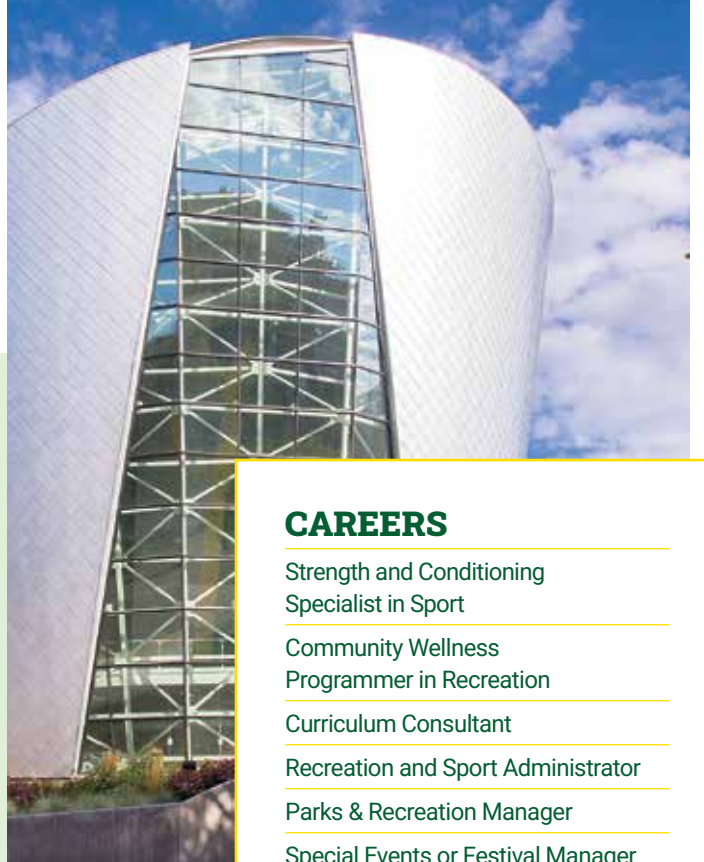

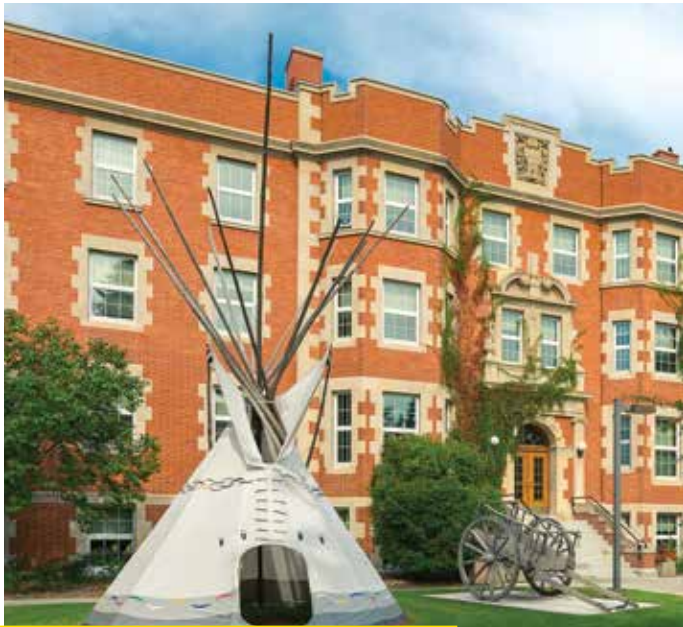

GPA Grade point average.

A student's average academic performance over a specific period, typically ranging from 0–4.0.

Bachelor degree A four-year undergraduate degree.

Major The main subject a degree is focused on. A major typically makes up 1/3 - 1/2 of the total courses a student completes as part of a degree.

Minor An optional secondary area of academic focus, taken in addition to a major.

Undergraduate The level of study of a Bachelor degree. Typically, undergraduate students have completed high school/secondary school and have not completed a higher education degree.

Graduate Post-graduate students have completed at least one Bachelor's degree and are pursuing a Master's or PhD level of study.

Semester An academic term. At the U of A a semester is approximately 4 months long. Fall semester is Sept-Dec and Winter semester is Jan-April.
